ACHIA NSW team member Shane Todd, Manager - Policy and Partnerships, has recently been embracing a new personal and professional development journey on the Executive Indigenous Leadership Program (EILP) with the Australian Graduate School of Management (AGSM) and the University of NSW (UNSW). The program consists of five (5) modules between May and November 2024, with a final program assessment before graduation.

While Shane could not attend the ACHIA NSW 2024 Aboriginal Housing Caucus as he was undertaking module 4 at Uluru in the Northern Territory, he did take some time to reflect on and share his experience, saying:

"Being on the EILP 2024 and especially in Uluru and Kata Tjuta, in Anangu (Aboriginal) Country, was an amazing honour and privilege. The lands of the Yankunytjatjara and Pitjantjatjara People, surrounded by 40+ aspiring Aboriginal leaders from all over Australia, was a truly amazing opportunity. I have made so many connections and many friendships and even met some of my own Mob. As importantly, I've also made important connections that will help me in my role with ACHIA NSW.

I am passionate about Mob and making a significant difference in the Aboriginal community housing sector. EILP 2024 has opened the door for me to learn important leadership and cultural skills that I hope to share along my

journey.

While sad that I could not be in Gamilaroi Country with ACHIA and ACHPs for the Caucus this year, I was thinking of everyone and reminded of why I am here in the first place."

You might like to consider how the **NSW Data Connector Service** can support your ACCO to access data relevant to your work and community.

The Data Connector Service is a joint program between the NSW Government and the NSW CAPO which intends to create a single point of contact in government for Aboriginal communities. This is where requests for access to government held data can be made.

The service aims to empower Aboriginal people through information.

Data Connectors, many of whom are Aboriginal, work across several government departments. There is also a central team, based in The Cabinet Office, that supports and oversees the service.

Coercive Control Workshops

The Centre for Community Welfare Training (CCWT), in partnership with the Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ) NSW, has developed specialised face-to-face training in response to recommendations made by the NSW Joint Select Committee on Coercive Control to support practitioners in identifying and responding to coercive control.

In November 2022, the NSW Parliament passed the Crimes Legislation Amendment (Coercive Control) Act 2022, creating a new offence for coercive control in intimate partner relationships, effective July 2024.

This training will be rolled out between June 2024 and November 2024 in preparation for the new legislation. Almost all courses are full. Checking the CCWT website (checked on 7th August, 2024), they have enrolment spots available at:

- Goulburn, NSW on 29 August 2024 Full
- Bourke, NSW on 4 September 2024 Register Here
- Port Macquarie, NSW on 9 October 2024 Full

The CCWT have other free online courses available to support staff who work with children, young people and/or their families.

Domestic and Family Violence Response Training (DV-alert)

DV-alert provides training to help frontline workers who are not specifically focused on domestic and family violence. They will be equipped with knowledge and skills to help people who are experiencing or at risk of domestic and family violence.

ACHP Grant and Training Opportunities

AHO Sector Capability Grants

Sector Capability Grants are designed to support Aboriginal Community Housing Providers business growth and self-sustainability, including achieving or maintaining NRSCH and NSWLS registration compliance. These grants provide an opportunity for the Aboriginal housing sector to increase their capacity and capability. There are two funding categories which offer different amounts of funding.

Grants from \$50,000, up to \$100,000 are available dependent on the grant category.

- Community involvement in planning Impact of planning on project feasibility.



- No BA Approval (NSW only) Van Homes are legally classified as caravans and able to stay on-site without building applications
- No BCA regulations again, as Van Homes are legally caravans, they can be sited in flood and fireprone zone areas

- Van Homes range in size from 17-59 square metres the average size of an apartment is 24 square metres
- They are built to order with various colours and cater for less mobile individuals
- Van Homes can be delivered to almost anywhere in Australia

The Van Homes team offers several finance options, and further information will be circulated to Caucus attendees in the coming week.

During the 2024 Caucus, Rebecca Pinkstone, CE of Homes NSW, spoke to Homes NSWs commitment to investing in and strengthening ACHPs in NSW to continue delivering critical housing supply and wrap-around support services to Aboriginal communities, including looking closely at various solutions, such as modular housing.
